Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza reported in Oregon Cat

Good afternoon,

This is Dr. Hewitt with Pawsitive Wellness reaching out regarding a report of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in a cat in Oregon. The cat contracted and died as a result of HPAI from raw/frozen pet food (Morasch Meat's Northwest Naturals brand 2 lb. Turkey Recipe raw & frozen). We are cautioning owners against feeding raw/freeze dried poultry and milk in addition to keeping outdoor cats indoors.

For this reason, the Oregon Veterinary Medical Association (OVMA) is encouraging owners to:

- 1. Avoid consuming raw or undercooked meat products
- 2. Avoid consuming raw dairy
- 3. Limit contact with sick or dead animals
- 4. Wash your hands after handling raw animal products or contact with sick/dead animals
- 5. Report sick or dead birds to ODA at 503-986-4711
- 6. Keep pets or poultry away from wild waterfowl

Additionally, please seek veterinary care if your pet appears to have the following signs of illness

- 1. Fever
- 2. Lethargy
- 3. Low appetite
- 4. Reddened or inflamed eyes
- 5. Discharge from the eyes and nose
- 6. Difficulty breathing
- 7. Neurologic signs, like tremors, seizures, incoordination, or blindness
